CCSI Fellowship

The CCSI Fellowship provides candidates with a living stipend while they work under the tutelage of an experienced master teacher. Fellows also receive tuition support, training and on-site mentorship and emerge with a master's degree and teaching certification in 15 months. Upon certification, fellows are ready to begin their teaching career as fully salaried teachers. In addition, they receive generous yearly salary supplements for up to 4 years of teaching in an under-served school and receive advanced training led by distinguished STEM faculty from the Claremont Colleges.

Noyce II Fellowship

The Noyce II Fellowship allows candidates to earn a teaching salary during the program. Fellows also receive tuition support, training and on-site mentorship and emerge with a master's degree and teaching certification in 15 months. Upon certification, fellows are career ready and can continue earning a full teaching salary. In addition, fellows receive yearly salary supplements for up to 2 years of teaching in an under-served school. Candidates must secure their own internship; however, CGU provides job search workshops and hosts career fairs to help candidates connect with prospective employers.

Why STEM?

A STEM educator is more than a traditional math or science teacher; rather, a STEM educator is a math or science teacher who has a deep understanding of the transferable skillsets that cut across the STEM disciplines and how these skillsets can be applied to real-world issues. CGU recruits individuals who have a strong STEM background and a desire to change lives by being middle or high school teachers. The program supports fellows through their credentialing program and MA in Education and provides the STEM-specific education and mentorship needed to be effective STEM educators.

The CGU Difference

CGU alumni are sought after by school employers, advance into leadership positions quickly, and are nominated for awards of excellence. In recent years, CGU alumni have won the California "Teacher of the Year" award, county-wide "Teacher of the Year" awards in Los Angeles, San Bernardino, and San Diego, and numerous school-level awards.
